All applicants for Lafayette's Maggin Family Creative and Performing Arts Fellowship must submit the following by February 1st (Early Decision Candidates may submit material sooner for earlier consideration):

- 1. One professional reference that relates to your particular artistic or creative endeavor. This may be a teacher, a professional or a mentor. You may use a reference already submitted in support of your admissions application, if applicable.
- 2. Example of your work: Please supply work(s) that best exemplify your artistic/creative pursuit. Acceptable examples include: writing samples; a digital recording of a dramatic or musical performance; images of work produced (flat or three dimensional images of painting, drawing, sculpture, photography, etc.); web links or CDs showing animation, written and recorded musical composition(s); choreographed work (s); film(s).

A short essay (250-500 words) discussing your commitment and passion for your artistic or creative interest and how you feel this fellowship might be used to impact your educational and personal experience at Lafayette College. If you have ideas of how you might put your fellowship to use, please feel free to share these preliminary ideas. You may attach a separate sheet if necessary.
